

SCO Standardized Billing 2017 Fact Sheet

What is SCO Standardized Billing?

SCO Standardized Billing is a new process that will utilize SAMS Claims functionality to generate ASAP invoices to SCOs, and upload response files to SAMS.

What are the benefits of this new billing process?

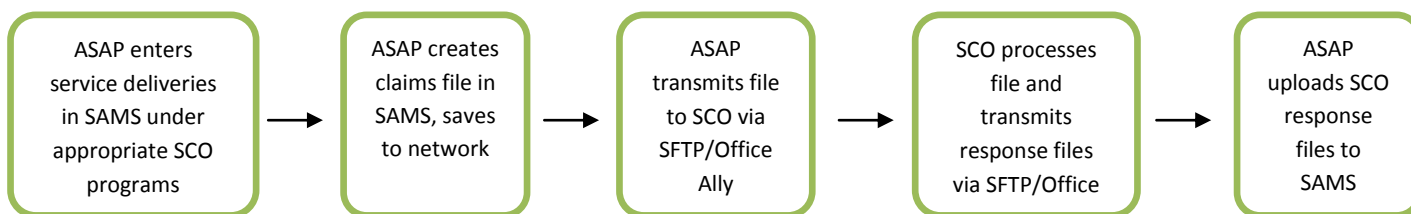
- Replaces a manual labor-intensive process for ASAPs and SCOs relying on offline databases and the exchange of spreadsheets.
- Eliminates customization of billing format and content for each SCO
- Produces HIPAA compliant, industry standard invoices (837s) to the SCO payers

Some new lingo that ASAPs will need to know:

Claim & Claim Response File Names:

- 837 – Claim file that is generated by the ASAP in SAMS and transmitted to the SCO
- 999 – Response file indicating if the 837 is properly formatted
- 277 – Response file indicating if claims within the 837 are properly formatted
- 835 – Payment Remittance Advice from the SCO
- **Office Ally**- The claims clearinghouse service that will be the ASAPs' one and only location for transmitting and retrieving SCO claims related files.
- SFTP (Secure File Transfer Protocol) – The secure method that ASAPs will use to transmit and retrieve claim related files, essentially by clicking and dragging from one folder to another.
